Community Transportation Benefits Program Overview

The San Mateo 101 Express Lanes Community Transportation Benefits Program helps cover transportation costs for qualifying individuals in San Mateo County. Participants can choose from one of two transportation benefits:

- \$200 transit credit on a Clipper Card
- \$200 toll credit on a FasTrak® toll tag

To qualify for the transportation benefits under this program, participants must meet the following **three** qualifications:

- 1. A resident of San Mateo County
- 2. Age 18 or older
- 3. Earning an individual income at or below \$82,260 (for 2024)

Participants are also eligible if they already receive at least one benefit through San Mateo County's Core Service Agencies Network. Eligible participants can enroll in the program at a Core Service Agency location in the county. A case manager will be assigned to them to help with the enrollment process and to verify eligibility.





How and Where to Enroll in the Program

Qualified individuals can enroll in the Community Transportation Benefits Program at any of the San Mateo County Core Service Agencies listed below. A Core Service Agency case manager will assist with the enrollment process for the preferred transportation benefit selection and verify each individual's eligibility.

FAQs: What You Need to Know!

Here are a few frequently asked questions (FAQs) about the Community Transportation Benefits Program and the two transportation benefits that are offered (\$200 Clipper Card credit and \$200 FasTrak® toll tag credit). Additional FAQs can be found on the Program Fact Sheet published on the website and can be downloaded HERE.

Is this transportation benefit limited to one person per household?

No, multiple people who live within one household may receive this benefit if they meet the eligibility requirements.

How do you verify eligibility for the program?

Eligibility is verified through paystubs, a letter from your employer, or a benefits letter. If none of these options are available to you, individuals may sign a Self-Declaration statement stating income.

Am I eligible for both a Clipper Card and FasTrak® toll tag?

If eligible, you can only select one of the available transportation benefit options that are offered – either a \$200 transit credit on a Clipper Card <u>OR</u> a \$200 toll credit on a FasTrak® toll tag.

Are there other transportation discount programs available?

Yes, Clipper START is a regional program that provides 50% in discounts on transit fares for qualified individuals. If you qualify for Clipper START, you will receive a different Clipper Card specifically associated with that discount program. For more information and to apply online, visit www.clipperstartcard.com/s/. You can call Clipper Customer Service Center to have your \$200 transferred onto a Clipper START Card (877-878-8883).

What happens after the \$200 benefit runs out?

If you select the Clipper Card benefit, you may continue using the card, but will need to load additional funds to pay for future transit trips. For more information, please visit: www.ClipperCard.com.

If you select the FasTrak® toll tag benefit, you can continue to use your toll tag, however you will need to add funds to avoid toll penalties. You may add additional funds using cash or a credit/debit card. For more information, please visit www.bayareafastrak.org.

\$200 in Free Transportation Benefits Now Available through the San Mateo 101 Express Lanes Community Transportation Benefits Program

The <u>San Mateo 101 Express Lanes</u> <u>Community Transportation Benefits Program</u> helps cover transportation costs for qualifying individuals in San Mateo County. The transportation benefits program is sponsored and funded by the San Mateo County Express Lanes Joint Powers Authority (SMCEL-JPA).

Eligible participants can now choose from one of two transportation benefit options! Either a \$200 transit credit on a Clipper Card or a \$200 toll credit on a FasTrak® toll tag.

To qualify for the transportation benefits under this program, a participant must meet the following three qualifications to enroll:

- 1. Resident of San Mateo County
- 2. Age 18 or older
- 3. Earn an individual income at or below \$82,260 (for 2024)

Eligible participants can enroll in the Community Transportation Benefits Program at any of the Core Service Agencies located in San Mateo County. If you are already receiving a benefit through San Mateo County's Core Service Agency Network, you are already eligible.

In July 2024, SMCEL-JPA doubled the benefit amount from the original \$100 credit to \$200, with the aim to provide more support to lower-income community members.

The program aims to improve mobility for people with or without cars by giving them the option to choose a transportation benefit that best supports their unique mobility needs. No other express lanes equity program in the country has this level of inclusive eligibility requirements or offers options for transportation benefits that qualifying residents can receive as part of the program.
